#### USE OF OUR BUILDING

Our church is used by a number of community organizations, several of them being engaged in service to others:

- ◆ **AA** A group meets on Monday evenings and a women's group meets Sunday afternoons
- ◆ NA A group meets on Wednesday evening.
- ◆ Boy Scouts Troop 3 meets here Mondays. Sponsored by the parish, this troop has served young men since 1915.

#### SPECIAL RESPONCES

**9-11** Our church responded to the national crisis of September 11, 2001 by providing goods for the workers and taking a team to St. Paul's Chapel to aid the workers at the World Trade Center site. A group of 15 from Trinity Church worked a twelve hour, overnight shift, feeding and providing supplies to the firefighters working at Ground Zero.


# 2005 Refugee Resettlement In

Trinity's Carnival has raised funds for Community Cupboard to purchase its new home.

## • INTER-FAITH HOSPI-TALITY NETWORK One month a year our parish hall becomes a temporary home for up to three families. During this time we provide meals and transportation for them.

Trinity sponsors an apartment at Hope Gardens, transitional housing, for folks moving from homelessness to their own homes.

#### **♦** EPISCOPAL COMMUNITY

**SERVICES** Trinity Church assists the mission of the Episcopal Church in the Philadelphia region through ECS. Each Christmas, gifts are gathered for children and their single mothers overcoming addiction and homelessness.

Each month REAL MEN COOK gather to prepare frozen meals that will be delivered to sick and homebound persons being served by agencies affiliated with ECS.

#### **♦ YOUTH GROUP MISSION**

**TRIP** Each year senior high students select a summer mission project. The goal of the project is to do a good work, and develop relationships with people of a different culture while building community among our own group members.
